“Rule by the People”

What was Greek democracy called? Answer - Demokratia.

“In the year 507 B.C., the Athenian leader Cleisthenes introduced a system of political reforms that he called demokratia, or “rule by the people” (from demos, “the people,” and kratos, or “power”). It was the first known democracy in the world.”

Elections Won by ONE vote!

Nov 2022 - For Mass. State House: Christopher Poulos defeated Tony Morrison for the 81st Assembly District, 5,297 to 5,296.

In 2008 – For Stockton (Calif) Unified School Trustee: Jose Morales defeated Anthony Silva, 2,302 to 2,301.

In 1977 – For Vermont State House: Robert Emond defeated Sydney Nixon. 572-571.

In 1876 – For President: Rutherford B. Hayes defeated Samuel Tilden by one vote in the Electoral College.

In 1824 – For President: John Quincy Adams defeated Andrew Jackson by one vote in the U.S. House of Representatives after a tie in the Electoral College.

In 1800 – For President: Thomas Jefferson defeated Aaron Burr by one vote in the U.S. House of Representatives after a 73 to 73 tie in the Electoral College.



The History of Election Cakes

“Election Day was considered an important holiday in early New England. In importance, it ranked second only to Thanksgiving.

Election Day Cake is actually a classic English fruitcake or plum cake. The original Election Day Cake included molasses, spice, raisins, and currants. Later brandy was added. Also known as Oak Cake, Hartford Election Cake and Training Cakes; because another name for Election Day was Training Day.”
