Folly's Investment STR Cap of 800 remains safe from:

- 1. Folly's City Council
 (At least for now.)
- 2. State Senator Sandy Senn
 (Her attempt to punish F.B. via a S.C. budget amendment did not succeed.)
- 3. Rep. Lee Hewitt & Bill 3253 (His bill to punish F.B. appears to have died May 3rd.)
- 4. Lawsuit Challenging the STR Petition and Referendum

(There are no guarantees but the odds are, this one will fail do to factual errors related to the plaintiff's initial filing.)

Unfortunately, there is a new STR threat from the S.C. Legislature

On Tuesday, May 9th, an amendment from the State House of Representatives was added to the state budget to punish cities with financial loss if they "prohibit" STRs in their cities.

Although this amendment would not impact Folly Beach(we did not prohibit STRs) it would open the door for the legislature to begin rolling back a city's right to regulate STRs and almost certainly lead to more STR oversight from Columbia in the future.

Lots of amendments are attached to the budget bill each year. Most do not survive. Let's hope this one will be removed before the budget is adopted.

Save Folly's Future is now a party to the lawsuit

The only hearing in the case was on Feb 9, 2023. A motion to allow Save Folly's Future to intervene was heard on Feb 9th and granted on April 6th.

The City of Folly Beach filed a Motion for Summary Judgement (Motion to Dismiss) nearly two months ago and on April 19th SFF filed its own Motion for Summary Judgement. Plaintiffs have also filed an amended complaint and a number of motions. No date is currently scheduled for a hearing on any of the motions.
